When broadcasting is aid.



Typhoons cause much suffering in the Philippines.

While Covid-19 has been the biggest show in town for two years, other disasters continue to challenge our global neighbours, and FEBC continues to offer communication as aid.

In December Typhoon Rai hit several major parts of the Philippines and our First Response Radio teams deployed immediately to offer the help that only radio can give: reaching distant and isolated people with life-giving information.

FEBC has four stations in the worst hit regions, so their broadcasts were changed from normal outreach and discipleship, to humanitarian programming. This includes information to the affected communities on where to find safe drinking water, updates on government relief work, where are the best cell phone signals, and messages of encouragement to all listeners.

When you support FEBC we fund radio purchases for numerous countries across Asia. Some funds are used to supply solar radios in vulnerable regions and ensure many households can tune-in when disaster strikes.

The Bigger Picture

FEBC International is largely focused on broadcasting audio programmes of outreach, discipleship, and

compassionate content. Programmes also address other life issues of justice, creation care, and disaster response.

‘First Response Radio’ (FRR) is an emergency initiative for times of natural disaster drawing on FEBC’s expertise and applying it to temporary relief efforts. FRR is a media relief organisation developed by FEBC International and shared with the world as a disaster response methodology.
